KEN'S PEN Devotional Fasting

“Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly” (Mat. 6:16-18).

Fasting—going without food in order to spend time in spiritual activities—is noble and difficult. When enacted, it gives us time to pray, teaches self-discipline, reminds us that we can live with a lot less, and helps us appreciate God's gifts.

Fasting is a direct result of one's relationship with God rather than a religious discipline. Unfortunately, much of what is supposed to represent religious devotion often results in religious discipline nonetheless. Our tendency, in response to hypocritical abuse, has been to throw out those practices that create the most unease. But given the potential for so much good to result, let's spend some time educating ourselves about the fast and its potential for our spiritual growth.

In the church, the fast has come to be a direct response to spiritual struggle, impassioned prayer, and evangelism. Fasting provides the petitioner with a unique set of benefits:

1. We are able to concentrate upon Christ as our “Bread.”
2. We are reminded that we are sustained by God.
3. We become more intense and urgent in our prayers.
4. We better demonstrate confession and repentance.

While Jesus was walking with the disciples on earth, there was no need to fast, seeing that His presence satisfied their deepest needs (Mat. 9:14f). Now, though, with the current level of outward distraction, the fast should represent a significant step in our concentration upon the Savior who awaits our future arrival in His eternal presence.

Matthew 6:16-18

Introduction:
