Hindrances to True Discipleship

“Now it happened as they journeyed on the road, that someone said to Him, ‘Lord, I will follow You wherever You go.’ And Jesus said to him, ‘Foxes have holes and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head.’ Then He said to another, ‘Follow Me.’ But he said, ‘Lord, let me first go and bury my father.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and preach the kingdom of God.’ And another also said, ‘Lord, I will follow You, but let me first go and bid them farewell who are at my house.’ But Jesus said to him, ‘No one, having put his hand to the plow, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God’” (Luke 9:57-62).

As Jesus was making His way to Jerusalem for the Feast of Tabernacles, He took the opportunity to pinpoint certain hindrances in the lives of three prospective disciples. The first candidate (vv. 57f) was full of zeal, but had not adequately considered the cost. Discipleship involved an active participation in Christ’s work with no promise of temporal comforts. Like this man, many people only see the benefits of Christian living, but are unwilling to pay the price that is required; to take the good with the bad.

The second candidate (vv. 59f) was personally called by Jesus, but was unable to set his priorities in order. One of the greatest difficulties in life is the constant juggling of responsibilities. Even the very pious act of burying one’s own father becomes an obstacle to growth when it preempts duty to God. To neglect that which one is reasonably equipped to do; is to carelessly substitute lesser activities for kingdom responsibility (cf. Luke 14:18-20; 2 Tim. 2:3f).

Similarly, there is nothing inherently wrong with the third man’s request to return home (vv. 61,62). However, Jesus emphasizes that true discipleship calls for one to keep his mind focussed on the task at hand. Those who begin with the work of God must resolve to go with it, or they will make nothing of it (Luke 8:13).

Jesus is not simply seeking followers; He is seeking disciples who are genuine and determined to serve. Serious adherents will be resolved to free themselves from life’s diversions, with a commitment to serve Christ to the fullest extent of their being.

Hindrances to True Discipleship

Luke 9:57-62

Introduction:

1. As Jesus was making His way to Jerusalem for the Feast of Tabernacles, He took occasion to pinpoint certain hindrances in the lives of three prospective disciples.
2. Since there is a danger in possessing the qualities exhibited in the lives of the three men mentioned in our text, let us identify some of the hindrances to true discipleship.

Discussion:

I. True Discipleship Is Hindered by Lofty Expectations (vv. 57,58).

II. True Discipleship Is Hindered by Conflicting Duties (vv. 59,60).

III. True Discipleship Is Hindered by Divided Loyalties (vv. 61,62).

Conclusion:

1. Jesus is not simply seeking followers; he is seeking disciples who are genuine and determined to serve.
2. Based upon our identification of some of the hindrances to true discipleship, let us be resolved to free ourselves from such burdens (if they exist in our lives) with a determination to serve Christ to the fullest extent of our being.
